Tile Barn Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th July 2019 Information and Kit List



We are fast approaching the Tile Barn Residential Trip and we wanted to remind you about some essential information for the trip.

Drop off time

Please can you ensure that your child arrives by 8am on Wednesday 10th July.

Any students who arrive late are likely to miss the coach.

Return time

We anticipate that we will be returning to the Academy on Thursday 11th July by 3.30pm.

This is dependent on traffic. If there are any delays, we will communicate this information via the text messaging service.

Student kit list and other useful information from Tile Barn include:

Clothes for activities

For all activities comfortable, nonrestrictive clothes and sensible fastening footwear are essential. Jeans are not suitable.

Camping kit list

There will be limited space in the tent, so please ensure clothes and baggage is kept to a minimum. Squashy bags are a good idea.

Kit List - Essential items

- A plate, bowl and cup plastic ones are a good idea
- A knife, fork and spoon
- Sleeping bag
- Pillow and pillow case
- Roll mat this will help to keep warm at night and make you comfortable
- Towel
- Wash kit
- Refillable water bottle

- • A torch with batteries
- Plastic bags for laundry and wet clothes
- Pyjamas
- Warm jumper or fleece and a hat and gloves even in the summer it can be cool in the evenings
- Waterproof jacket and trousers
- A clean change of clothes for each day
- A small day rucksack
- Sun block and sun hat
- Medication (where appropriate given to your Group Leader)

Optional Items

- Wellies it can get muddy on the camping field and in the Forest
- Camera a disposable one is a good idea (optional)

Valuables and electrical appliances

Although Tile Barn is a safe and secure site, the centre cannot lock tents. Students are therefore requested by the centre not to bring unnecessary valuables as Tile Barn cannot accept any responsibility for lost or damaged items.

Lost property

We recommend that all clothes and possessions are clearly labelled. Tile Barn holds lost property for two weeks so if a student leaves anything at the centre you will need to contact them directly.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones will <u>**not**</u> be allowed on the residential trip. Any student with a mobile phone will have their phone removed before we depart and this will be kept in the office until the end of the Summer Term. The phone

Staff without exception, shared that they feel the teaching cycles are really benefitting the students and their learning has improved significantly.


Extra-curricular activities and enrichment opportunities are also something staff really value. Some highlights include winning the Boys Football League as well as all of the trips and events to universities and Sky.

Be Kind – Personal Support and Smaller Form Groups

As you know developing strong relationships with all at Bolder is really important to us. We are really pleased with how well we know our students and families, ensuring we provide the right support.

We are though always looking at ways to develop our strong pastoral care – we know that being happy at school is fundamental to great learning. So, to support this further, we are going to reduce the number of students per form in year 8. This will mean students will be in groups of no more than 25 as opposed to 30.

We have considered friendships and strong relationships that have formed as we have reviewed who will be in each form. The students will be introduced to their new form group after the Tile Barn trip.

Please may we take this opportunity to remind all families that term time holidays are not permitted. In so many aspects our Academy is outstanding however, we are finding that due to a significant number of unauthorised leave, our attendance figures are nearly below the national average.
