- There are 36 Pupil Premium students who entered the Academy in September 2019 with middle prior attainment average scaled Maths and English SATS score between 96 and 107.
- There are 38 Pupil Premium students who entered the Academy in September 2018 with middle prior attainment average scaled Maths and English SATS score between 96 and 107.

Higher Prior Attaining Students:

- There are 15 Pupil Premium students who entered the Academy in September 2020 with high prior attainment NGRT SAS score between 108 and 130.
- There are 15 Pupil Premium students who entered the Academy in September 2019 with middle prior attainment average scaled Maths and English SATS score between 108 and 120.
- There are 16 Pupil Premium students who entered the Academy in September 2018 with middle prior attainment average scaled Maths and English SATS score between 108 and 120.

Speech and Language Support:

- 12 Pupil Premium students across Years 7-9 have been identified through early assessment to have a need for Speech and Language Support.
